I have always had a deep love for all animals and have always tried to find good homes for all the stray cats and dogs. The Sandhills has an overabundance of stray cats and dogs that need good homes, but we also need to focus on controlling this overpopulation. That is why I have chosen to get involved and support our new Companion Animal Clinic of the Sandhills (CAC).

I was very disappointed to find out that we have one of the highest euthanasia rates in the state of North Carolina because we also have one of the highest numbers of unwanted cats and dogs. The goal of the Companion Animal Clinic is to decrease the number of unwanted dogs and cats by offering low-cost spay and neutering. It is my hope that we can manage the overpopulation of dogs and cats and put an end to unnecessary euthanasia.

To achieve our goals we need your help. A very generous donor has made a building available on US Highway #1 North in Vass, North Carolina. We are in need of funds to outfit the building as a veterinary clinic and hire a veterinary staff to cover the day to day operation of the clinic.

The goal to make CAC a reality is \$595,000. CAC has raised a significant amount towards this goal to date; however, we have a long way to go as we enter into our public fundraising campaign. I hope you will join us in our efforts to reduce overpopulation of companion animals in the nine county regions we will service.
